Best Civilian Aircraft or U.S. Coast Guard Subject

In remembrance of friend and fellow modeler Richard J. LeGaye, this award recognizes work judged to be the best representation of a civilian aircraft or U.S. Coast Guard subject.

Dioramas are eligible for this award. The OzCon Head Judge will have final say over eligibility for this special contest category. The model may be any scale, any era and may be made out of any modeling medium: resin, plastic, wood or even paper. There will be a special trophy for this category. Models will be entered in the standard contest at OzCon and will be eligible for standard awards. Each eligible model will be specially marked and will be judged a second time specifically for this award.

Judging for this special category will be independent of the standard contest. Awards given in the standard contest will not affect eligibility for this special award (for example, eligible model A wins best of category in the standard contest, but eligible model B - from the same category as eligible model A - may win this special award instead).

Best 1930s Subject

Our new location for the show, the Kansas Aviation Museum, was originally dedicated as the Wichita Municipal Airport on March 31, 1935. In celebration of this historic date we are sponsoring a new contest category for the best model of a 1930s subject.
